Welcome to 2022. We are expecting another busy and challenging year. There are record numbers of carers contacting the organisation for support through Carer Gateway and our other state funded programs, and staff are working hard and doing their best to respond.

Ongoing pandemic uncertainty may mean at times we have to adjust our plans, particularly where we aim to have face to face contact with carers (eg. at community events). We can only apologise in advance if we must respond to State Government health directives at short notice, but

I am sure you can understand that this is not within our control. Our aim and our approach is to plan to deliver services as we normally do and then adapt (or potentially cancel events) if circumstances dictate, rather than postpone events months in advance. I would rather we plan to do something rather than plan not do something.

One event we are planning to deliver is a state-wide conference late in 2022. We also plan to travel extensively around the state to improve our support and awareness of our services to regional and remote communities.

Again, circumstances may limit what can be done and we need to be aware of the sensitivity and vulnerability of these communities.

Carers Connect has been extended

Do you want support to start education or employment?

Carers WA has been successful in securing a second round of funding for the Carers Connect to Education and Employment project, through the Department of Social Services. This program will be delivered by Carers WA, in partnership with the Australian Medical Association.

Carers Connect provides an opportunity for carers to study and/or gain employment in the Care Industry (eg. Aged Care, Community Services, Disability, Health Care and Mental Health) or another industry with skill shortages.

The Carers Connect Team will provide oneon-one coaching to help carers to identify skills and overcome barriers, and financial assistance to enrol in training to achieve their career goals.

To be eligible for this program, carers must:

- Be in a caring role within the last 2 years
- Be aged between 16-65 years
- · Currently unemployed or underemployed.

Meet Jaynie - Carer Coach

Carers often have to set aside their own needs because of conflicting priorities. A Carers WA Coach supports carers to find a balance between their responsibilities as a carer and their own needs.

The Carers WA Coaching program, launched in mid-2021 as part of Carer Gateway, and has assisted many carers with support to create and work towards goals. For example, working through new business ideas, starting on de-cluttering a house or incorporating self-care into a daily routine. Many carers don't have a specific goal in mind when they first meet their Carer Coach but having the chance to solely focus on their wants and needs for a period of time can help clarify changes the carer would like to make and work through hurdles or challenges that are stopping progress.

Coaching is flexible and free. Carers receive six, one-hour coaching sessions that can be structured around their individual needs. Carers have the option to attend faceto-face, over the phone, or online.
